FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT, YEAR "B"

This fourth Sunday of Lent is traditionally known as 'Laetare (Rejoice!) Sunday', and within our readings there are indeed reasons for rejoicing. We hear in the First Reading from Chronicles of the destruction of Jerusalem and the days of exile, but God, working through the Persian king, Cyrus, not only brings joy to the Jewish people in bringing them home to where they belong but also helps them rebuild the Temple in Jerusalem.

Paul writes of God, whose nature is Universal Love, which gives us life in and with Christ Jesus through the gift of his infinite grace. All our good works and our lives lived in all their fullness are a grateful and joyful response to all we have been given by God.

The Gospel tells us that the resurrection of Christ Jesus, who was 'lifted up and exalted' on the cross, which brings salvation to all who believe in him and in his teachings. Christ's Passion, for all its injustice and brutality, is a glorious revelation of God's love for all of humankind, and the source of our healing. Jesus calls us to live by his truth and light, where we can dwell in the flow of God's energy and love.

Through the love of God, the transforming power of the cross and the gift of eternal life, let us ask for greater faith in the Creator who loves the world and that all peoples may follow Christ's Way of Light.
